CIOL Recognition, Validation & Certification (RVC) Accreditation

What is it?

CIOL's Recognition, Validation and Certification (RVC) accreditation is designed to offer universities and other organisations that deliver language education, vocational learning and assessments for linguists a formal means to achieve recognition and validation of their programmes and activities, through alignment with the UK's Chartered body for linguists.

Who is RVC for?

CIOL RVC accreditation is now available worldwide to organisations in the field of languages (learning, assessment and training) that meet the criteria required for each level of the scheme.



The scheme is suitable for general adult language and specialist vocational learning programmes at CEFR (Common European Framework) level B1/B2 and above; notably:

- those delivering English degrees, degrees taught in the English language, or providing English-language training for working professionals;
- those providing undergraduate, master's or other courses for specialist linguists e.g. interpreters, translators.

Applicant organisations submit evidence against a framework and receive a detailed and confidential report and recommendations with a free-to-use, non-confidential summary statement for public use if successful.

Successful applicants thus benefit from accreditation from the UK's Chartered body for language professionals of their programme's structure, language content, linguistic level, delivery and outcomes.

What are the RVC accreditation levels?

There are three levels of accreditation: Recognised, Validated and Certified. Each level requires prior achievement and compliance with earlier levels, i.e. to apply to have a programme Certified, it must already be Recognised and Validated.
